

# National County Teams Championships Rules



## Teams for day 1

- These will be created by combining the scores from the three archers from the county.
- Awards will be given for the teams by bow style and division (i.e. recurve men team).

## Teams for day 2

- Teams will be split into tiers as follows, no team changes or swaps will be permitted (for incomplete pairs teams please see Note 1 at the end of the document):
  - Tier 1 – Top scoring man and woman from the 70m/50m round on Saturday
  - Tier 2 – 2nd Place man and woman from the 70m/50m round on Saturday
  - Tier 3 – 3rd Place man and woman from the 70m/50m round on Saturday
- Seedings for the pairs team head-to-heads will be decided by the Sunday qualification round.
- Awards will be presented for the top 3 placed pairs teams in Tier 1 only.
- Overall results will be calculated as follows, using the top two tiers and the 3rd tier as a tie-break.
- Men's team ranking position + women's team ranking position + pairs team (Tier 1) position + pairs team (Tier 2) position.  
i.e.
  - 1st place at the end of Saturday for both teams, 1st Place at the end of Sunday in tier 1 and 1st place in tier 2 = 4 points, and so would be in 1st overall.
  - If a total combined score is tied, then Tier 3 position would be used to break the tie.

## Single entries

- Counties can enter a single person into the competition to create a pairs team for the Sunday. The individual archer will shoot the qualification round on the Saturday but will not take part in the team head-to-heads. The archer will then shoot in the qualification and matches on the Sunday with the archer from the same county.
- Single entry fee - £50

# National County Teams Championships Rules



## Note 1 - Incomplete pairs teams

- For pairs teams where it is not possible to field a pairs team in Tier 1:
- The top scoring athlete and bottom scoring athlete from the single gender team (i.e. compound men) would be paired and placed into Tier 2.
- The middle scoring athlete would be placed into Tier 1, and in their first match will shoot all 4 arrows. At the end of the match, they will, if they win, take the correct opposing team's member forward for future rounds.

Example:

COUNTY A men's compound

Athlete A 678  
Athlete B 654  
Athlete C 632

Athlete A+C in Tier 2, Athlete B in tier 1

COUNTY A Vs County B – Tier 1

Athlete B (shooting all 4 arrows every end) scores a total 114 - County B scores 113.  
County A take the women's compound of County B into their paris team for future matches.

At the end of the head-to-head, the final ranking points from Tier 1 for COUNTY A and COUNTY B will be whatever the finishing position of the combined pairs team will be as they have both contributed.
