Round	World Record Status World Archery 50 and 70m rounds followed by Head to Heads. Ladies and Gents World Archery 1440 Star Rounds.

Registration	Registration from 08.00 on both days. Proof of membership must be provided		
Event Timings	Assembly at 08.30 on both days. Practice of up to 45 minutes from 08.45 The competition will start immediately afterwards		
	No shooting line tents to be erected until 4:30pm on the night before the competition		
Event Format	Saturday – Following practice the WA 50/70m round will be shot in a double detail with six arrows shot in four minutes. There will be a comfort break at three dozen. On completion of the ranking round there will be a break while the seeding's are completed for the Head to Head rounds. Official practice for the afternoon will be taken during this time. A cut may have to be applied depending on entries and timing, although it is hoped that all Archers will go through to the Head to Head. Higher placed Archers will receive a bye in the earlier rounds. Matches will be shot to current WA rules.		
	Sunday – Following practice the Ladies and Gents WA 1440 round will be shot in a double detail with six arrows shot in four minutes all throughout the day. Compounds and Recurves will shoot on individual six zone 80cm faces at 50 and 30m. Barebows and Longbows will shoot on a full single 80cm face at both 50m and 30m. The Championship titles will be based on performance over the three rounds. Archers must complete all three rounds to be considered. Only Archers shooting distances appropriate to their class may enter.		
	This event will host the Home Nations match on the second day of the Championships (The WA1440 round). Team Managers are asked to submit their teams two weeks prior to the closing date (Therefore the 09 July), after which any reserved spaces will be allocated to archers on the waiting list and team Managers will then have to pick their teams from the Archers that are entered.		
Home Nations	Please note that team members will be expected to enter and pay for both days. The organisers will endeavour to group teams together on the shooting line.		
Junior	Juniors are welcome to shoot on an equal footing with senior archers. Boys with the Men, Girls with the Ladies. There is a separate Junior Championship and therefore, there are no Junior awards at this event.		
Awards	National Trophies and the Championship Title will be awarded to the highest placed British Archery GB members. After the presentation, all trophies must be returned to the Tournament Organiser. Medals will be awarded on the following basis. 1-3 Archers – 1 st . 4-6 Archers - 2 nd , 7-9 Archers – 3 rd ., 10+ Archers 4 th .		
Entry Fee	£43.00 for both days. There will be no refunds after the closing date, and there will be no option to pay and shoot only a single day.

It is recommended that you log into your account ahead of the opening date to ensure details of people you wish to enter are up to date and hold a valid membership.</p> <p>Please ensure the organiser is aware of any special requirements you may have. Archers who are unable to get to the target should arrange for an assistant to aid in scoring and arrow collection. Closing Date	Midnight on the 23 July 2018, If you cancel your entry 28 days, or more, before the event then you will receive a refund, less 20%. If you cancel after the 28 day limit there is no refund.

Dress	Please refer to the Archery GB Rules of Shooting for the dress regulations. Archers should comply with dress regulations until after the presentations.
Testing	Archers competing at record status tournaments may be subject to testing. Competitors who are approached to give samples must comply, Non-compliance will be treated as a positive result. By entering this competition, you consent to testing, if you are entering a minor into this competition you consent to the testing of that minor, this is inline with UK Anti-Doping Policy, Rule 5.7.2.
Lost Arrows	Lost arrows must be reported to a judge or member of the field party (please remember to inform them if you later find the arrow). It is the archer's responsibility to account for all arrows before leaving the field.
Photography	In line with the recommendation in the Archery GB Safeguarding Policy, those who wish to take photographs or video at this event are to register with the Tournament Secretary on arrival. Unauthorised photography is not permitted. If you are concerned about any photography taking place at this event, please contact the tournament organiser directly.
Refreshments	On both days, food will be available from the Lilleshall shop in the Cricket Pavilion.
Camping	Basic tent and caravan pitches are available in the bottom field with portable event toilets. Please contact Lilleshall directly at www.lilleshallnsc.co.uk or on 01952 603003 Showers are available in the pavilion or Queens Hall only.
Smoking	We are bound by Lilleshall's smoking policy which says no smoking on the sports pitches. Therefore the smoking area is on the access road. Please note that this rule applies to those using electronic cigarettes or vaping.
Stoves & Burners	Please do not put stoves, burners or hot water urns directly on the grass.
Pets	Animals, except for assistance animals, are not permitted at Lilleshall National Sports and Conferencing Centre.
