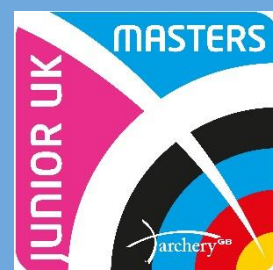


# Oxford Archers

### The UK Junior Masters 2019

Round	WRS/UKRS six dozen arrow ranking round followed by head to head within age and discipline categories. Champion of champions will be decided by a shutdown format, with all winners participating regardless of age or discipline, and the archer shooting the arrow furthest from the centre of the target being eliminated on each pass.

Awards	The UK Junior Masters titles will be based on performance in the Head to Head final rounds. Awards will also be made to age group winners and a single Champion of Champions out of all disciplines			
Eligibility	Those under 21 on 1 January 2019 and claiming Junior Master Bowmen in 2018 are eligible to enter. Ages are as on the day of competition. Archers may only shoot the bow style with which they qualified for this event in the preceding year.			
Scoring	Please be aware that parents could be asked to help with the scoring.			
Dress	Please refer to the Archery GB Rules of Shooting for the dress regulations. Archers should comply with dress regulations until after the presentations.			
Drug Testing	Archers competing at record status tournaments may be liable for drugs testing. Competitors who are approached to give samples must comply. Non-compliance will be treated as a positive result. Parents / Guardians must sign the relevant box on the entry forms giving consent for junior archers (Under 18's) to be drug tested if approached.			
Lost Arrows	Lost arrows must be reported to a judge or member of the field party (please remember to inform them if you later find the arrow). It is the archer's responsibility to account for all arrows before leaving the field.			

Photography	In line with the recommendation in the Archery GB Safeguarding Policy, those who wish to take photographs or video at this event are to register with the Tournament Secretary on arrival. Unauthorised photography is not permitted. Photos and video taken at this event may be used by Archery GB across its communication channels to promote the sport. If you are concerned about any photography and videos taking place at this event, or do not wish to be photographed please contact the tournament organiser directly.
Refreshments	Hot and cold refreshments will be available all day, including breakfast, burgers, hot rolls, and a selection of cakes.
Camping	We regret that we will not be able to provide camping on site this year. For local campsites we suggest Valley Farm (Eynsham) or the Oxford Camping and Caravanning Club site. Special Note	Please ensure that the organiser is aware of any special requirements you may have. Please do not assume that we already know. Archers who are unable to get to the target are requested, if possible, to arrange for an assistant to aid in scoring and arrow collection. If this is not possible, then please contact the organiser in advance of the tournament for advice.
Smoking	Designated smoking area only - 10m behind the tent line. Please note that this rule also applies to those using electronic cigarettes.
Stoves & Burners	Please do not put stoves, burners or hot water urns directly on the grass.
Pets	Well behaved pets are welcome but must be kept on a lead and may be asked to leave the site if disrupting the event. Owners are expected to clean up any mess and place it in the bins provided; non-compliance with this rule will result in your removal from the site.
Car Parking	Follow the target signs at the venue. There is a c.300m walk to the tournament field from the car park - a kit shuttle will be provided for your equipment. If you require disabled parking (blue badge holders only) please notify us in advance of the tournament.
