Entry Information	<p>Entries to be submitted via the membership portal: https://agb.sport80.com A waiting list will be in operation as soon as the event is filled, once you have been moved from the waiting list you will be given a 48 hour window to accept your place.</p> <p>It is recommended that you log into your account ahead of the opening date to ensure details of people you wish to enter are up to date and hold a valid membership.</p> <p>Please ensure the organisers are aware of any special requirements you may have. Archers who are unable to get to the target could you please try to arrange for assistance to aid in scoring and arrow collection. Practice	<p>At the following events the practice field will be available from 5pm the evening before the competition: UK Masters, Junior national outdoor championships, national county team championships, British target championships.</p>
Assistance	<p>Please ensure the organisers are aware of any special requirements you may have. Archers who are unable to get to the target could you please try to arrange for assistance to aid in scoring & arrow collection. If this is not possible please contact the organiser directly who will assist, this must be least 7 days prior to entry.</p>
Anti-doping	<p>Archers competing at record status tournaments may be subject to testing. Competitors who are approached to give samples must comply, Non-compliance will be treated as a positive result.</p>

	By entering this competition, you consent to testing, if you are entering a minor into this competition you consent to the testing of that minor, this is inline with UK Anti-Doping Policy, Rule 5.7.2.
Awards	All trophies must be given back to the tournament organiser unless told otherwise.
Event formats	Event formats can be changed on the day due to unforeseen circumstances by the competition manager, competition organiser and judge in collaboration with competitors.
Lost Arrows	Lost arrows must be reported to a judge or member of the field party (please remember to inform them if you later find the arrow). It is the archer's responsibility to account for all arrows before leaving the field.
Photography	In line with the recommendation in the Archery GB Safeguarding Policy, those who wish to take photographs or video at this event are to register with the Tournament Secretary on arrival. Unauthorised photography is not permitted. Photos and video taken at this event may be used by Archery GB across its communications channels to promote the sport. If you are concerned about any photography and videos taking place at this event, or do not wish to be photographed please contact the tournament organiser directly.
