<p>General Points of Eligibility</p>	<p>Archers are eligible for consideration provided they are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An Archery GB member in good standing • Have satisfied all eligibility under the rules of World Archery (WA) and subject to any changes it may introduce subsequent to the publication of this policy • Have satisfied all eligibility under the rules of the University Sports Federation (FISU) including the revised upper age limit for archery athletes: athletes must be born on or between 1 January 1994 and 31 December 2001 • Available for selection of the stated event • Hold a current full UK passport, valid for at least six months after return date of the event • Have met the selection scores (see below)

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Athletes representing Archery GB at the World University Games will be required to successfully move through two stages of selection (see selection process and criteria below) The Athlete Pathway Manager, Pathway Programme Manager, Compound Programme Manager and Olympic Senior Coach will consider only athletes deemed to be competent at this level. They may therefore elect to take fewer than the maximum permitted athletes for these events.

Selection process	Athletes will move through two stages of a selection process: Stage 1 – Submission of scores and selection of team Stage 2 - Representation. Selected athletes will be required to maintain or improve their standards in line with the selection criteria in order to participate in the event and represent Great Britain.	
Nomination and Selection Panel	Following the completion of the designated selection process listed in this policy, the Athlete Pathway Manager, Pathway Programme Manager, Compound Programme Manager and Olympic Senior Coach will take into account a range of views deemed necessary to discuss the nomination of the athletes such as Coaches and Sport Science and Medicine practitioners.	
The ‘Team’	The ‘Team’ means the team which is selected by Archery GB which includes athletes, coaches, nominated reserves, medical support personnel, team leaders and any associated members of the World Class Programme team.	

<p>Appeals</p>	<p>Appeals against process must be submitted within 72 hours of the selection announcement on the dates stipulated above.</p> <p>Appeals will be conducted according to the policy on the Archery GB website, which can be downloaded from the following location: http://www.archerygb.org/national-squads-records/selection-criteria/</p>
<p>Following the conclusion of the selection process</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Once athletes have been advised of their selection by the Athlete Pathway Manager, they must agree not to withhold any information on availability, fitness, injury status or illness that could affect their training or competitiveness at any time until the conclusion of the event; 2. All selected athletes must declare any medications they are taking, in particular the use of any restricted medications and that they hold a valid Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) which can be produced when required by the relevant authority; 3. An athlete will be required to sign up to the Team Members’ Agreement and any breach of this may result in disciplinary action including removal from the team and possible early return home from an event. In this case, any member sent home will be invoiced for the full cost of their entry into the event and any additional cost incurred in sending them home. Decisions on these matters are open to appeal as allowed by the relevant Archery GB Disciplinary process effective at the time of the incident. 4. Athletes selected for the team are required to attend all related training camps and competitions agreed in the required event preparation process from the selection announcement onwards. 5. Athletes and other team members will be expected to demonstrate they can actively contribute to the team unity required to be a successful international team and will be required to maintain or improve standards and behaviours to participate for Archery GB.
<p>Announcement</p>	<p>Selected team members must agree not to make any announcement to the media or public in any form (including on any social or other media) regarding their selection until after Archery GB have announced the selection on the Archery GB website www.archerygb.org</p>
<p>Any matters not covered by this Policy</p>	<p>Any matters arising from the selection processes, which are not covered within this policy, shall be determined by the Athlete Pathway Manager, Pathway Programme Manager and Compound Programme Manager (or representative thereof) in conjunction with the Director of Sport.</p>

SELECTION PROCESS & CRITERIA	
<p>STAGE 1: Obtaining an Invitation to the Selection Process</p>	<p>Minimum standards are set for entry into the selection process.</p> <p>1. Registration and Performance Tracking</p> <p>1.1 From February 2019, athletes can register up to ten scores achieved in WA70/WA50 rounds in an online score tracking system: https://www.surveymonkey.co.uk/r/2019WUG</p> <p>1.2 Athletes can register up to ten scores in one entry but may register as many entries as they wish. Athletes are encouraged to update their score submission if new high scores are achieved after original submission.</p> <p>1.3 It is the athlete’s sole responsibility to ensure they register their scores and that those scores have been accepted onto that system.</p> <p>1.4 Registration on this tracking system will automatically be taken as an expression of interest for entry to the selection process.</p> <p>1.5 This system will allow athletes to retrospectively add their scores from 1 April 2018, which is compulsory for consideration.</p> <p>1.6 Athletes must have registered their scores by Monday 1 April 2019.</p> <p>1.7 The Athlete Pathway Manager, Pathway Programme Manager, Compound Programme Manager and Olympic Senior Coach will discuss the nomination of athletes based on submitted scores.</p> <p>1.8 Archery GB also reserves the right to take into consideration other aspects, including athlete conduct and previous performances, when considering invitations to the selection process. It is not an athlete’s right under any circumstances to be invited. Where other elements are taken into account, the athlete has a right to be given the explanation as well as a right to appeal.</p>

	<p>2. Performance Standards for Consideration</p> <p>2.1 Minimum Qualifying Scores (MQS) have been set for Archery GB to consider inviting athletes into the selection process.</p> <p>2.2 These scores do not constitute an automatic level for nomination or selection, only a minimum standard set for athletes to engage in the process.</p> <p>2.3 The MQS on a WA70/WA50 round set are:</p> <table border="1" data-bbox="400 674 1331 954"> <thead> <tr> <th></th> <th>Recurve Men</th> <th>Recurve Women</th> <th>Compound Men</th> <th>Compound Women</th> </tr> </thead> <tbody> <tr> <td>Minimum Level and Frequency</td> <td>2 x 628 at 70m</td> <td>2 x 582 at 70m</td> <td>2 x 670 at 50m</td> <td>2 x 645 at 50m</td> </tr> </tbody> </table> <p>2.4 These scores have been set in the context of the 2019 competition year and the stated function for this event. Maintenance and improvement of standards</p> <p>3.1 Athletes are required to maintain or improve standards and behaviours to participate for Archery GB.</p> <p>3.2 Athletes will be expected to demonstrate ability to engage in the performance environment, adopt an effective performance lifestyle and make a positive contribution to the team unity required to be a successful international team.</p> <p>3.3 Archery GB reserve the right to deselect an athlete and/or nominate a different athlete on the basis of competitive performance standards.</p>
