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OUTDOOR ARCHERY

All forms of archery can return – no gathering limits

Target boss centres minimum of 3.66m apart

Target & Field - Max. 2 archers per target boss, or 1 household/bubble

Clout – Up to max 10 per clout

Social distancing **MUST** be maintained off the line

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DISABILITY ARCHERY

- Indoor archery permitted
- Disabled archers and those needed to make the activity happen
- Always wear a face covering, apart from when actively shooting/exempt
- 2m target centre spacing (with screens)
- 3.3m target centre spacing (without screens)


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-  1:1 Coaching permitted
-  Group coaching – up to a maximum of 12
-  Have a Gos – not permitted
-  Taster & Beginners can resume

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COMPETITION



4 step return to Competition

- Step 1 - March 29. Members to shoot at own clubs, no competitions to run in this period in line with the government's request to keep travel local.
- Step 2 - April. UKRS one-day competitions can run, but attendance should only be from regionally based competitors. For a national event to run it MUST be of high importance and deemed necessary (e.g. for GB team selection or pilot events for testing precautions and measures). Field competitions are free to run in a one-day format only, with priority to local entries or those seeking team selection scores.
- Step 3 - May 17. Competitions are able to be run with WRS but all AGB guidelines must be observed and followed.
- Step 4 - June 21. Competitions to run with reduced distancing restrictions, more information to follow once government guidelines are published.

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REQUIREMENTS OF CLUBS WHEN RUNNING COMPETITIONS

Host clubs are required to complete the actions below when hosting competitions

- Complete a full risk assessment
- Complete the event delivery plan
- Produce a venue plan showing:
 - Distance between the targets (we recommend 5m, will accept 4 in some cases)
 - Access points from car park, one way route if possible
 - Shooting line tent layout / Identification of any pinch points

The above must be distributed to the following in advance of the competition

- The head judge / All volunteers working at the event
- A set must be kept on file as AGB could ask to see proof of completion



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NATIONAL COMPETITION UPDATES

- The British Field, 3D Champs and JNOC will run in 1-day formats, with social distance restrictions in place.
- The Youth Festival, British Target Championships and UK Masters are currently being planned to run in their normal formats. This may change.
- The UK Masters - September 25/26 to give everyone a fair chance at qualification for the event. In addition, all those invited in 2020 will be invited for 2021.
- Unfortunately, the National County Team Championships will not run in 2021, we will bring this event back in 2022 and it will be held on the weekend of 24/25 September, this later date will give counties more time to select their teams.
- GB Rankings will start in line with Step 4.
 - Numbers of entries at events will be monitored, to see if the rankings are working fairly.
- National Tour standings will be taken from Tier 1 and Tier 2+ events only to decide the line-up for September's finals.

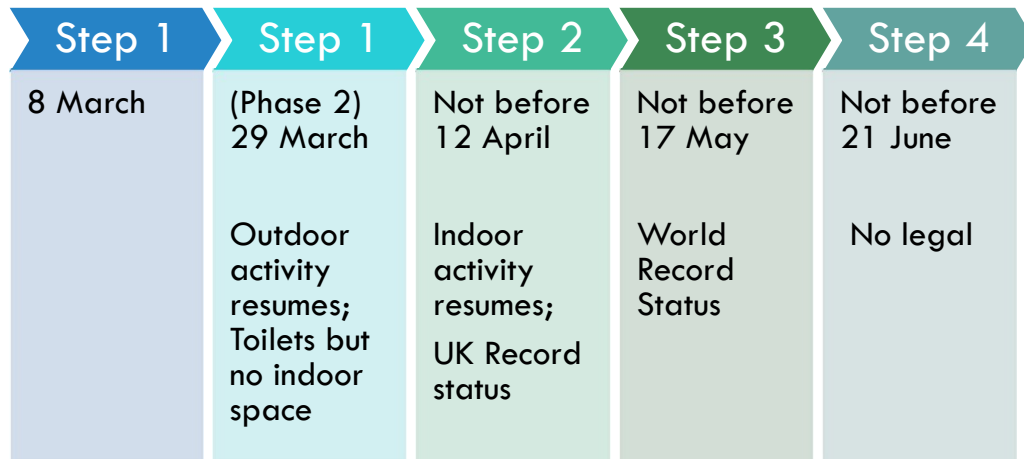
