<p>1. Competition Format/s</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Individual • Team • Maximum places per category as follows: • 3 x Compound Women, Men & Youth • 3 x Recurve Women, Men & Youth • 3 x Barebow Women, Men and Youth* TBC
<p>2. General Points of Eligibility</p>	<p>Archers are eligible for consideration provided they are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An Archery GB member in good standing • Have satisfied all eligibility under the rules of World Archery (WA) and subject to any changes it may introduce subsequent to the publication of this policy • Available for selection of the stated event • Hold a current full UK passport, valid for at least six months after return date of the event • Have met the selection scores (see below)
<p>3. Milestone Event Performance Target/s</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3 x Medals
<p>4. Context and Purpose of Milestone Event and Championship selection</p>	<p>The Performance Director in conjunction with the Programme Manager and programme leader and coaches will consider only athletes deemed to be competitive at this level, and may elect to take fewer than the maximum permitted athletes for these events.</p>
<p>5. Selection Window</p>	<p>The window for attainment of scores will be: October 1st 2021 – December 4th 2022 (athletes are allowed 1 score from the 2019 GB National Indoor Championships or 2020 Nimes Tournament) (We are allowing scores from</p>

	these past high profile events to help with what is a very short qualifying window.)
6. Selection process	<p>Athletes will move through three stages of a selection process:</p> <p>Stage 1 – Qualify for selection shoot through achievement of selection scores</p> <p>Stage 2 - Selection and ratification of the team</p> <p>Stage 3 - Representation. Selected athletes will be required to maintain or improve their standards in line with the selection criteria in order to participate in the event and represent Great Britain.</p> <p>Athletes are required to complete all stages of the selection process to be eligible for selection. Should an athlete not be able to participate in part of the selection process due to illness, injury or international representation, they will need approved medical or programme exemption from Archery GB personnel. Further consideration of this athlete will be done in line with criteria below.</p>
7. Selection Scores	<p>Recurve</p> <p>Men 585 Women 575 Youth Men 580 Youth Women 570</p> <p>Compound</p> <p>Men 589 Women 583 Youth Men 580 Youth Women 570</p> <p>Barebow</p> <p>Men 510 Women 480 Youth Men 460 Youth Women 445</p> <p>2 selection scores must be shot at WRS or UKRS Events on WA18m rounds only.</p> <p>Scores to be shot between 1 October 2021 and 4 December 2021. 1 score can be taken from the National Indoor weekend 2019 or Nimes Indoor 2020.</p> <p>Athletes are responsible for submission of scores to Jon.Nott@archerygb.org</p>
8. Selection Shoot	<p>If more than 3 athletes obtain the qualification scores, there will be a selection shoot on Sunday 5 December at the National Indoor Championships.</p> <p>Each archer will have their score from the national indoors added to both qualification scores. The 3 archers with the highest total score from the total of 3 scores will be the selected team.</p>

	<p>It's the responsibility of the athlete to enter this event in time to ensure there are no problems, if you fail to get a space in the event and a selection shoot is required this will be seen as you not wishing to participate.</p>
<p>9. Nomination and Selection Panel</p>	<p>Following the conclusion of the selection process, a selection panel will be convened to confirm selections for the event. The Panel will consider only athletes deemed to be competitive at this level, and may elect to take fewer than the maximum permitted athletes for these events.</p> <p>The representatives at this meeting will be made up of the following;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Performance Director (Chair) • Squad Coaching Staff (as appropriate) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ A representative from Recurve ○ A representative from Compound ○ A representative from Barebow • Other Performance Archery Staff (as appropriate) • Performance Co-ordinator (Meeting notes) <p>In selecting a team that is in keeping with the context and aims of event selection in section 3, the panel will consider all available information, including, but not limited to athletes who have been unable to train or compete due to injury / illness or any other unforeseen circumstances, maintenance of form and fitness, performance readiness, performance potential, medal target, performance pedigree (including international medals won), injury/illness history, behavior and contribution to a team ethos.</p>
<p>10. The 'Team'</p>	<p>The 'Team' means the team which is selected by Archery GB which includes athletes, coaches, nominated reserves, medical support personnel, team leaders and any associated members of the World Class Programme team.</p>
<p>11. Appeals</p>	<p>Any selection appeal must be registered in line with the process identified in the Performance Appeals Policy which can be found here - http://www.archerygb.org/national-squads-records/selection-criteria/</p>
<p>12. Following the conclusion of</p>	<p>1. Once athletes have been advised of their selection by Archery GB, they must agree not to withhold any information on availability, fitness, injury status or illness that could affect their training or competitiveness at any time until the conclusion of the event;</p>

<p>the selection process</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. All selected athletes must declare any medications they are taking, in particular the use of any restricted medications and that they hold a valid Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) which can be produced when required by the relevant authority; 3. An athlete will be required to sign up to the Team Members’ Agreement and any breach of this may result in disciplinary action including removal from the team and possible early return home from an event. In this case, any member sent home will be invoiced for the full cost of their entry into the event and any additional cost incurred in sending them home. Decisions on these matters are open to appeal as allowed by the relevant Archery GB Disciplinary process effective at the time of the incident. 4. Athletes selected for the team are required to attend all related training camps and competitions agreed in the required event preparation process from the selection announcement onwards. 5. Athletes and other team members will be expected to demonstrate they can actively contribute to the team unity required to be a successful international team and will be required to maintain or improve standards and behaviours to participate for Archery GB.
<p>13. Announcement</p>	<p>Selected team members must agree not to make any announcement to the media or public in any form (including on any social or other media) regarding their selection until after Archery GB have announced the selection on the Archery GB website www.archerygb.org</p>
<p>14. Any matters not covered by this Policy</p>	<p>Any matters arising from the selection processes, which are not covered within this policy, shall be determined by The Performance Director and (or representative thereof) in conjunction with the Compound Programme Manager.</p>
